UCU dean murder: Prime suspect found with Tumwebaze's property

The Police have arrested the prime suspect linked to the murder of Pamela Tumwebaze, the dean of students at Uganda Christian University (UCU) Mukono.

The suspect, identified as Hussein Dak Taewaiko, was picked from his hideout in Budaka district on Saturday.

Kampala Metropolitan Police spokesperson Racheal Kawala said: "The Joint Security Task Team investigating the murder of Tumwebaze has successfully arrested one of the key suspects identified as Hussein Dak Taewaiko in connection with the crime."

Kawala said the suspect was found in possession of Tumwebaze's property, including a phone, a critical piece of evidence linking him to the murder.

"Preliminary findings further indicate that the suspect is a former house help to the deceased," Kawala said, adding that investigations into the matter are ongoing.

STRANGULATION, WEDDING PLANS

Tumwebaze was planning to wed her new fiancé at the time of her death, UCU vice-chancellor Aaron Mushengyezi told mourners on Friday.

Mushengyezi told the mourners who converged for a funeral service at UCU's Nkoyoyo Hall that Tumwebaze looked worried during her last days.

"She looked depressed although she did her job well. One day, I was forced to ask her what the matter was, but I think Police will help us find out more," Mushengyezi said.

Reports indicate that Tumwebaze was seeking to divorce her husband, Alex Matsiko, at the time of her death.

Mushengyezi said the university management had covered the funeral costs.

CHANCELLOR'S EULOGY

In his eulogy, the university's chancellor, Dr Stephen Kaziimba – who was represented by the Bishop of Mukono, Enos Kagodo – said the university had lost a great pillar.

was going through, she remained courageous. We hold her family and friends in prayers. You will be dearly missed. Nevertheless, let us remember Pamela by emulating her good work," Kaziimba said.

Bishop Kagodo challenged the Police to parade the suspects before them, for scene reconstruction just as they did when they arrested the five suspects linked to the murder of former Ntaawo Police post officer-in-charge, Emmanuel Bagenda.

The UCU community described the late Tumwebaze as a great leader, Christian and mother who served the students' fraternity well.

EDUCATION BACKGROUND

Tumwebaze studied at Uganda Martyrs Primary School, Kinyansano Girls' High School for O'level and Kyeizooba Girls' High School for A'level.

She went to UCU, Mukono, where she pursued a bachelor of arts in education. She got a first class degree and was retained by the university. In 2007, she upgraded to a master's in literature, and did another master's in strategic communication last year. At the time of her death, she was pursuing her doctorate in journalism, media and communication.

Tumwebaze was born on September 30, 1979, to the late Charles Nkwiita Tumwebaze and Loe Tumwebaze. The fourth-born in a family of six, Tumwebaze was laid to rest yesterday at her ancestral home in Kashari, Mbarara district.
