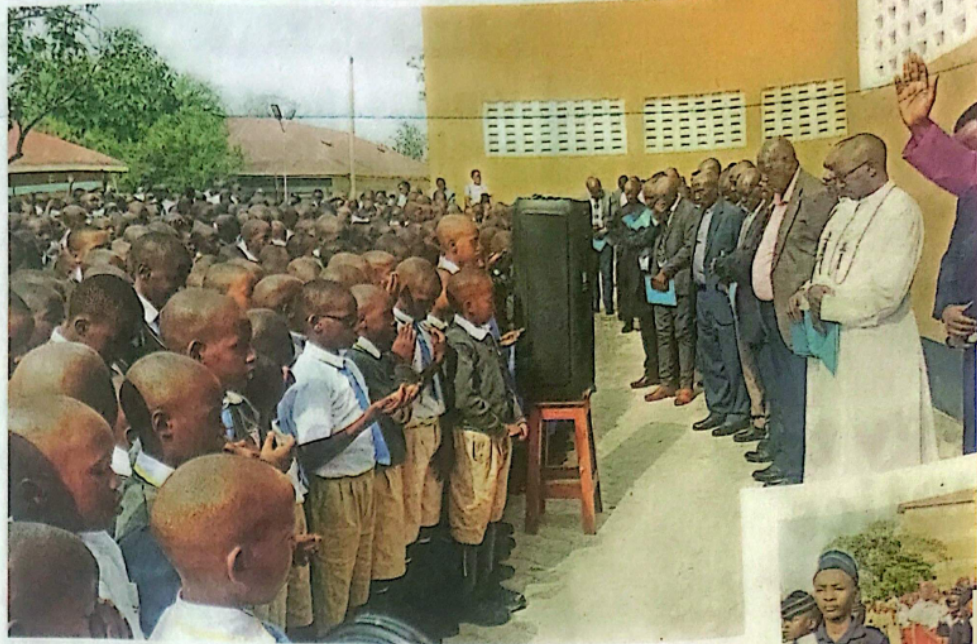




Mbarara Junior School celebrate PLE success
