The Mukono Police Flying Squad boss died in a car accident along the Katosi-Kisoga Road in Mukono, as he chased after suspected robbers. As a man of God with unyielding faith, Muhoozi maintained his commitment to our heavenly Father.

In a poetic and moving eulogy, Moses Magezi, elder brother of Muhoozi, recalled a man who loved life, was a source of joy for his family and had a genuine affection for the people he encountered. He said he was the "most popular student and prefect in the different schools he went to. In his two years with Police, he followed his colleagues and enlisted to serve his country.

He was a "great listener who never judged. There was always a twinkle in his eye and he loved having fun," Magezi said.

"The time I spent with my husband, I found that he was a responsible man, who loved his family. He had plans of building a house and was eager to celebrate the birthday of his young daughter in January. God has called my husband! I promise to keep our children and see them grow into responsible citizens," she said.
