Two students maintain top position two years later

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KAMPALA. Two students out of the 52 top performers in Uganda Certificate of Education (UCE) results two years ago have maintained their good standards in national examinations in high school.

An analysis of Uganda National Examinations Board (UNEB) results shows that Ronald Ogwang of Gombe SS scored Aggregate eight in his best done eight subjects at O-Level in 2013, and has maintained his good performance in the 2015 Uganda Advanced Certificate of Education (UACE) after he got 20 points.

St Mary's SS, Kitende's Bashir Mubiru also posted outstanding results at both levels of education.

While the duo are guaranteed of admission to any public university on a government scholarship in case they applied, it will be different for Merryland HS, Entebbe's Dut Sunday Riak and Grace Gibwa Ashley of Gayaza High School, who each passed with Aggregate 12 in O-Level but got five and 9 points in A-Level, respectively.

Sunday Monitor considered candidates who had scored between aggregate eight and 12 in their best done eight subjects at Senior Four.

The analysis of these shows that nine students scored 20 points, 40 students got 19 points, while 61 students obtained 18 points. Thirteen students got below 10 points in the A-Level results.

In an interview with *Sunday*

Monitor, Mr Wilson Nsubuga, the deputy head teacher of King's College Budo, said although his school admits best students, they get disappointed with some of them when they report.

"We expect the best out of the

students we admit. Unfortunately, the results are not as genuine as we thought. At times we get the best in Senior One but after first term, we feel like chasing them. You wonder whether those scores were theirs," Mr Nsubuga said.
