

Rotary cancer run to raise funds for bunker

The Rotary Club is to raise \$1m for the construction of a cancer bunker at St Francis Nsambya Hospital.

The plan was revealed during the launch of the Rotary cancer run for the Entebbe Chapter on Saturday in the Mayor's Gardens in Entebbe town.
