

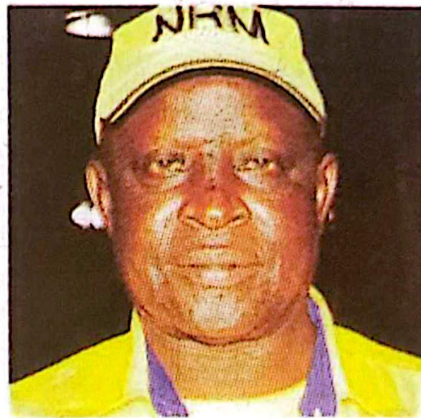
# MP Abiriga summoned over urinating in public

**KAMPALA.** Arua Municipality MP Ibrahim Abiriga had up to 600 public toilets in Kampala city to ease himself, but chose to urinate on a wall fence near the Ministry of Finance offices, court has said.

City Hall Court has summoned the legislator to answer to criminal charges of committing a nuisance by easing himself in public, contrary to the local governments (Kampala City Council) maintenance of law

and order ordinance, 2006.

According to the criminal summons issued out on Wednesday, the MP, who is popularly known as the 'yellow Abiriga' given his yellow signature dressing and advocating for the amendment of Article 102 (b) of the Constitution to scrap the presidential age limit, is wanted in court next Friday.

"You are commanded ... to appear in this court on October 6, 2017 at 9am or soon thereafter the case can be heard," the summons read in part.

Particulars of the charge sheet state that Mr Abiriga on September 26 at Apollo Kagwa Road, Central Division of Kampala, became a nuisance by urinating on the wall fence.

Recently, the MP confessed to the act in a televised interview at the entrance of Parliament, saying he was 'badly off'.

"I was badly off. Should I have kept urine on myself? What is the problem with that?" Mr Abiriga asked.

His confession came after pictures of him urinating went viral on social media platforms.
