Ghana sack manager Addo, 72 days before World Cup

ACCRA. Ghana have sacked manager Otto Addo, 72 days before the start of this summer's World Cup.

Addo's departure followed a 2-1 defeat by Germany in a friendly in Stuttgart on Monday, and a 5-1 thrashing by Austria in Vienna last Friday.

The Black Stars, who are in the same World Cup group as England, have lost their last four games and despite having Manchester City winger Antoine Semenyo and Tottenham forward Mohammed Kudus among their ranks, failed to qualify for the 2025 Africa Cup of Nations under Addo.

Following the Germany game, the Ghana Football Association said, external it had "parted ways" with Addo and his exit was "effective immediately".

It added: "The Ghana Football Association will communicate the new technical direction of the Black Stars in due course."

Addo, 50, was born in Germany and spent his entire playing career in the country, also winning 15 caps for Ghana.

Mehtha SS delivered a ruthless statement to reclaim supremacy in Buikwe District, thrashing St Andrew's Lugazi 7-2 in the USSSA district final at SCOL Stadium on Saturday.

The emphatic victory ended a two-year dominance by Quality High School Buwundo and underlined Mehta's return as the district's most feared attacking force. With goals flowing freely

throughout the campaign, Mehta barely broke stride in the final, overwhelming a St Andrew's side that had earlier benefited from a controversial petition to reach the finals.

St Andrew's progressed after petitioning Quality for fielding an unregistered player in the semifinals—despite losing 5-0 on the pitch—but there was no dispute in the final as Mehta's firepower proved decisive.

Mukono Kings stand tall

In Mukono District, Mukono Kings continued to stamp their authority, emerging from the quarterfinal stage without conceding a single goal. They haven't conceded a goal since the qualifiers started.

They opened with a composed 2-0 victory over Merryhill, with fleet-footed Maliki Makumbi and Patrick Afeku on the score sheet, before beating hosts Kasana Vocational 3-0.

The biggest statement came against free-scoring Seroma, who were silenced 3-0 as Mukono Kings marched into the semifinals.

Their defensive solidity has made them early favourites as they prepare to face Central College Kabimbiri in the semifinals. In the other last-four clash, Seroma will take on Dynamic SS.

Head coach Shafiq Mudholo said his side is focused on bigger targets.

"We have built this team on organisation and hunger. The boys are improving with every game, but our ambition is to compete strongly at the nationals," he said.

Birikwalira leans on winning pedigree Seroma head coach Dan Birikwalira be-

lieves his experience at the highest level of schools football can inspire his side as they chase history.

"We need to win the trophy to show that we have some success. This is our second year in the schools finals and my target is to qualify the team for the nationals," Birikwalira said.

The young tactician brings a rich pedigree, having featured prominently at the national level between 2009 and 2013 with St Mary's Kitende. His sides reached multiple finals, winning national titles four times and adding further success in 2013 alongside four FEASSA trophies.

"My trophy-laden career gives the players momentum and a winning mentality. It creates trust between me and the players. This is a new team and we need to keep winning to impress our funders," he added.

Seroma, appearing at this stage for the first time, will hope that experience can carry them past Dynamic and into the final.

Kayunga set for final showdown

In Kayunga, St Mark will face Namagabi in Wednesday's final at Ntenjeru Staza Grounds.

St Mark booked their place with a 2-0 win over Hopeful Future, while Namagabi edged Ndeeba SS 3-2 on penalties after a goalless draw.
