City authority suspends street parking along Kampala Road

KAMPALA. The Kampala Capital City Authority (KCCA) has suspended on-street parking along Kampala Road and parts of Jinja Road in a move aimed at reducing traffic congestion and improving movement within the central business district.

In a public notice issued yesterday, KCCA announced that motorists will no longer be allowed to park along Kampala Road and Jinja Road from the Entebbe Road junction up to the Yusuf Lule Road junction near Kitgum House.

According to the Authority, the directive took immediate effect and will remain in force until further notice.

KCCA said the decision was taken to improve traffic flow, enhance safety for all road users and support better mobility in the city centre, where traffic congestion has remained a major challenge, especially during peak hours.

Speaking to *Daily Monitor* yesterday, the KCCA spokesperson, Mr Daniel Nuweabine said the affected areas have officially been turned into no-parking zones.

"From the time of suspension, no one is allowed to park around those areas because they are now no-parking zones. Those who have been using those streets should look for another alternative or nearby parking yards," Mr Nuweabine said.

He added that enforcement officers

had already begun implementing the directive and warned motorists

against violating the new parking arrangement.

"We request motorists to cooperate with our enforcement teams to ensure smooth traffic flow within the city. The purpose is to create order and improve movement for all road users," he said.

Mr Nuweabine added that under the new arrangement, motorists have been advised to use alternative parking spaces along Station Road, Dewinton Road, Said Barre Avenue and Nkrumah Road.

"We encourage drivers to utilise parking spaces within buildings and premises they intend to access, as well as commercial off-street parking facilities at the National Theatre, Uganda House and the multi-storey parking yard

along Portal Avenue," he said.

The KCCA spokesperson added that roadside parking along major streets has for years contributed to heavy traffic congestion, delayed movement and increased the risk of accidents in the city centre.

"The suspension is part of wider efforts by KCCA to streamline transport management and improve road usage in Kampala as the city continues to experience rapid urban growth and increasing vehicle numbers," he said.

Mr Nuweabine appealed to motorists and the public to comply with the directive as the Authority works towards creating what it described as a safer, more organised and efficient transport system.
