

She Corporate on the brink of second title

KAMPALA. Following their 2-1 win over St. Noa Girls Zana on Saturday, She Corporate have every right to believe they can be 2025/26 Finance Trust Bank Fufa Women Super League (FTBFWSL) champions.

The Jinja-based side has all its departments working well to secure a second title. They needed keeper Molly Naava to keep them in the game played at home at Fufa Technical Cen-

tre, Njeru and she did.

But early second half goals from Rebecca Nakato and Jessica Namanda put them in control. Imelda Kasemire pulled one back for 5th-placed St. Noa, who want to finish their first topflight season in third position, in the 80th minute but it came a little too late.

It was not only St. Noa hoping She Corporate, who now have 50 points from 20 games, could be stopped. Far west in Kampala, Kawempe Muslim had hopes of returning to the summit of the league.

They were hosting Rines SS, who have only pride left to play for this season. Kawempe scored first through Jovia Nakagolo but Rines equalized six minutes later through Jasmine Nalukwago.

However, in the 65th minute, captain Agnes Nabukenya

got the winner but it only kept them two points behind She Corporate with two matches left to play.

Battle for third

Rines remained 9th with 20 points - just one point ahead of 10th-placed Lady Doves who lost 2-1 at home to Kampala Queens (KQ). KQ, who won the title last season, now have some comfort in their bid to finish third - which is the highest position they can manage this season. They have 35 points after Joanita Ainembabazi 53rd minute winner helped them long after Jamirah Nabulime's 10th minute opener had been cancelled in the 23rd minute by Sharifah Nakigudde's equalizer for Doves. St. Noa, which has two games in hand - against Uganda Martyrs High School (UMHS) Lubaga and She Maroons - were hoping to upset KQ but are stuck on 27 points. The 4th-placed UMHS, with 29 points, drew 1-1 away at She Maroons.
