

Makerere fails to issue transcripts

KAMPALA. Makerere University has failed to issue transcripts as promised for students who graduated from the university last week.

The university's Vice Chancellor, Prof Barnabus Nawangwe, during the first day of the 68th graduation ceremony last week, said the university had decided to decentralise issuance of academic transcripts to colleges in order to ease the process.

"I am happy to report that all students that have fulfilled all the requirements for graduation can pick their transcripts from their respective colleges. Giving graduands their transcripts on graduation day is what we are supposed to do as a world class university and I am glad it is happening," Prof Nawangwe said.

The [promised] issuance of the transcripts to students was to start this week on Monday, but a number of students failed to pick up any

transcripts at their colleges since the University Senate had not yet posted them to

the schools and colleges.

But Prof Nawangwe on his official twitter handle acknowledged the delays and promised to deliver all transcripts to the colleges by next week.

Daily Monitor could not reach Prof Nawangwe to explain the delays since he is out of the country.
