New Kamuli boss warns civil servants

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KAMULI. The winner of the Kamuli LC5 seat, Mr Thomas Kategere, has warned civil servants in the district of tough times ahead unless they deliver and stop wasting swindling public funds.

"The people have spoken of their tiredness with corrupt civil servants so anyone who has stolen public funds or picked money from public coffers should pay back or resign," Mr Kategere said while addressing the media on Thursday.

He defeated Mr Charles Mugude Kuwembula, who

was running on an Independent ticket, after garnering 31,933 votes while his rival got 27,444 votes.

Others in the race were Mr Kaloli Dhizaala who polled 1,947 votes, Ndhegwe Mubarak (5,920) and Moses Aliba (832 votes).

Mr Kategere said despite efforts by prominent politicians to bring him down, the people spoke out.

"This is victory of the peasants where transparency has beaten sycophancy," he said.

Mr Kategere replaces Ms Salaamu Musumba after she contested for the Kamuli Municipality MP seat and lost.
