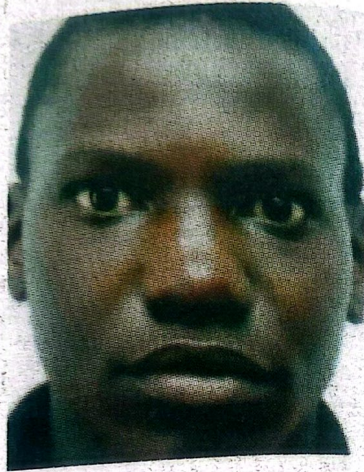


Kitovu boy no stranger to success
