Don't abandon children to govt, Janet cautions

KAPCHORWA. Education and Sports
minister Janet Museveni has warned
parents in Sebei Sub-region against
abandoning their school children for
government to feed.

The minister said unless the par-
ents start providing meals to school
children, government would not con-
struct a secondary school in Gamao
Sub-county in Kapchorwa District.
The Sub-county, which is a hard-to-
reach, has two primary schools with
no secondary school.

But Ms Museveni, while commis-
sioning school facilities at Chebelat
Primary School on Tuesday, said good
buildings and new schools alone were
not enough to facilitate learning and
improved academic performance. The
facilities were built with support from
Global Partnership for Education proj-
ect. Chebelat primary school is one of
138 schools funded under the project
across the country.

"If I hear that now children in this
primary school are eating lunch, then
I will also build the secondary school.
If you don't, then I won't because chil-
dren's learning is a joint responsibil-
ity. Do not leave the responsibility to
government and teachers," she said.

Ms Museveni said it is shameful
for parents in Sebei Sub-region not
to feed school children yet they have
fertile soils for abundant food produc-
tion. She asked education officials and
leaders in the region to ensure parents
provide lunch so that government can
get assurance of providing quality
education.
