Medical interns lay down their tools

Medical interns at Mulago Hospital have laid down their tools over non-payment of their three-month allowance arrears.

The strike started on Tuesday following the Government's failure to remit the interns' January allowances to their accounts.

There are over 970 intern doctors working this year, 61 of whom have not been paid.

Medical interns are entitled to a net monthly pay of sh600,000 to cater for their accommodation, transport and meals.

"Last year, we joined the

doctors' strike protesting poor facilitation, inadequate supplies and poor working conditions," Dr Robert Lubega, the president of medical interns said.

"Despite the Government's promise to improve the situation, there has been no commitment and will, to fully implement what was agreed on during the stakeholders, dialogue we held," he added.

Lubega explained that interns in other hospitals received their partial payments for the three months' arrears, but those at Mulago and Soroti hospitals have not been paid since December; yet they are expected to deliver services.
